### PROF. PROCTOR'S SON INSANE.

ST. LOUIS, April 6.—A dispatch was received in St. Louis this evening from Mrs. Proctor, widow of Prof. Richard Proctor, asking that her son Richard be found and detained, as he is insane. Prof. Proctor died with yellow fever in New-York, and a son died a short time afterward at the family residence in St. Joseph, Mo.

Young Richard nursed his brother, and, at his death, developed signs of mental derangement. He has grown worse, his controlling idea being that he was possessed of great wealth. Yesterday he disappeared from his home in St. Joseph, and his mother thinks he will come to St. Louis. He is entirely without means. A careful watch is being kept, and if found he will be held for his mother.
